From The Pastor...

HIP HOP HURRAY?

These are strange times. For those who haven't heard the news, popular hip-hop artist, Kanye West (husband of Kim Kardashian) just released his 9th album and, at present, it is by far the most popular album in the country. In fact, all 11 of the songs on this album debuted on the top 100 songs according to Billboard Magazine. This is a remarkable achievement, but this in itself is not what's so extraordinary. What is strange is the title and content of this particular album. It's called "Jesus is King" and every song is unashamedly Christian.

For those who don't know Kanye West. I don't recommend listening to his prior works. His songs, though well produced, are dark and depraved and thoroughly self-focused. But now, He is traveling the country with a different message. In every concert and every interview, he is clearly and boldly proclaiming Jesus as the Lord and Savior. Here is a sample from one of his songs, entitled "God Is":

All the captives are forgiven. Time to break down all the prisons

What are we to make of all this? Is Kanye West really a Christian? I hope so, but honestly, I don't know...and I don't care. As Paul says in Philippians – Some preach Christ out of wrong motives...but what do I care, Christ is preached and in this I rejoice. (Philippians 1:15-18)

Born in 1840 into a privileged Virginia plantation, Charlotte Diggs Moon was a smart, forceful woman who could have achieved any goal she wanted. But God's call focused "Lottie" Moon's life on sharing Christ's love with China's lost masses. For 37 years she endured hardship and danger in a land oppressed by famine, disease and war; all the while calling Southern Baptists to join her. In the end, she loved the Chinese more than life itself, giving her own food to starving neighbors and dying of starvation herself. Lottie left behind a legacy of Chinese believers, Chinese churches and a Southern Baptist passion for missions.

Where does it go? The Lottie Moon offering goes to fund the International Missions Operation of the Southern Baptist Church of which we support as a church and will go 100% to support oversees missionaries who are preaching the gospel of Christ.
