From The Pastor...

Worship Matters

Reading through the Old Testament prophets with the 2019 Bible Readers has been eyeopening, especially the book of Jeremiah. In this book, the Prophet Jeremiah is explaining to the Kingdom of Judah why the LORD who brought them into the Promised Land is about to kick them out. In a few short years (586 BC to be precise), the LORD will send Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon, to bring absolute destruction upon Jerusalem and the Temple itself. Many Jews will perish and the remaining survivors will be sent far away into exile.

Why would God not just allow but command such devastation on His own people? Jeremiah records the charges against Judah. Below are just a few of the relevant passages:

I will declare my judgments against them, for all their evil in forsaking me. They have made offerings to other gods and worshiped the works of their own hands. (Jeremiah 1:16)

Your evil will chastise you, and your apostasy will reprove you. Know and see that it is evil and bitter for you to forsake the Lord your God; the fear of me is not in you, declares the Lord God of hosts. (Jeremiah 2:19)

I will doubly repay their iniquity and their sin, because they have polluted my land with the carcasses of their detestable idols, and have filled my inheritance with their abominations." (Jeremiah 16:18)

Indeed, the people in Jeremiah's day were guilty of all sorts of atrocities: their society was full of deceit, violence, oppression, immorality and corruption of all kinds. But these were not the real issue. These were more like symptoms and not the actual disease. No, the heart of the matter was not their abuse of one another, but their careless neglect of worship.

As we see above, they did not hate the LORD, they simply forgot Him. They did not fear Him nor seek Him. They simply drifted away from Him. They had no interest in His Word and they did not gather to give Him the praise and thanks for who He is and all He's done. Instead, they went after false gods and made idols for themselves just like every other nation. What's worse, their leaders did not stop them, but led the way:

An appalling and horrible thing has happened in the land: the prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests rule at their direction; my people love to have it so, but what will you do when the end comes? (Jeremiah 5:30-31)

Their preachers lied to them and their worship leaders played along with the lies...and the people loved being lied to.

This is not just a problem with the Jews...it is the problem with all mankind. Remember the judgment proclaimed against us all in Romans 1:18-23

The wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth... For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

Did you catch that? The wrath of God is directed against us not so much for what we have done, but for what we have NOT done...we did not honor God nor give Him thanks. We did not worship God! This is a stinging rebuke that we must take to heart.

What are we to conclude? For starters, worship matters...a lot! It is of utmost importance that we seek the LORD and worship Him in the manner that He has commanded. Worship is why He created us in the first place and the reason He sent His only Son to save us from our sins and why He sent His Holy Spirit to turn our hearts back to Him. The greatest desires and joys of our hearts are found in the presence of our God and Savior, especially when we gather together to worship Him in Spirit and in Truth.

This is why we will be taking several Sunday mornings in October to reflect much more deeply on this matter of worship. We will consider who, why, when and especially how we are to worship. I hope you can join us!
